

Bringing 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time' to the Northenden stage has been a fantastic experience and a massive team effort!

Based on Mark Haddon's award-winning 2003 novel, the play invites us inside the remarkable mind of Christopher Boone, a 15-year-old with an extraordinary talent for logic and mathematics, and a uniquely challenging relationship with the world around him.

Haddon's book was celebrated not only for its compelling mystery, but also for the compassionate way it encourages us to see differently — to recognise the beauty, humour, and difficulty in perspectives that don't match our own.

Simon Stephens' stage adaptation first premiered in 2012 and quickly became a global phenomenon with the original production going on to win seven Olivier Awards.

Imagination is a key prerequisite for our audience tonight and has been something, I hope you'll agree, the cast has brought to the stage with abundance, recognising that this is a very different play and huge privilege to inhabit the mind of Christopher and tell his story!

I hope our production offers you the same sense of wonder, connection, and curiosity that first drew me to the play.
